



Our history

We started Heritage in 2007 with 16 pupils aged 4-7. Today, we have approximately 200 pupils between age 4 and 16. We have grown gradually with the oldest class, year upon year. The story is told by the pictures on the stairs near the main entrance.

Our culture

We have sought to create a learning culture that takes the long view, where we focus upon robust intellectual growth for its own sake and upon other critical facets of personal development. Our view is that if we stay clearly focussed on the healthy development of our pupils as a whole, they will perform well in exams and make a strong transition to Sixth Form and beyond.

Our results

Our 2020 Year 11 Leavers faced an unprecedented challenge with the cancellation of exams. We are very proud of how they managed lockdown and of the grades they were awarded and rightly deserved.

- 100% of pupils obtained at least five 9-5 (A*-C) grades including English and Maths.
- 70% of all grades were 9-7 (A* or A).
- 85% of all grades were 9-6 (A*, A or B).
- 2 pupils out of 17 were awarded 9s in all 10 of their subjects.
- All pupils secured the results they needed to progress to the school or college of their choice.

Over the years, our leavers have gone to numerous schools and colleges in the Cambridge area for further study. The majority have gone to Hills Road Sixth Form College. Others have attended Comberton Sixth Form, Long Road Sixth Form College, The Perse School, The Stephen Perse Foundation, Oakes College, Parkside Sixth Form, and Impington Village College. Many of our leavers have now started courses at leading universities, including Politics and Philosophy at Oxford, Engineering at Cambridge, and Medicine at Leeds.

Moving forward

Despite the challenges of Covid-19, we continue to provide a rich and stimulating educational experience for our pupils. We are continuously monitoring and carefully implementing all Government guidance, as the safety of our pupils and staff is paramount. When lockdown started in March, we made a rapid transition to online learning and delivered a very effective remote service to pupils of all ages. We are well prepared to transition rapidly to online learning once again should it become necessary.

We are delighted that Child Light Limited, the charitable company which operates Heritage School, recently became the owner of 17-19 Brookside. Our hope and intention is to serve Cambridge families from our sites on Brookside and Panton Street for decades to come.
